Field Day is one of the biggest Amateur Radio events in North America. Sponsored by the American Radio Relay League, Field Day is an exercise in emergency communications - in the field. Several thousand teams will be operating non-stop from Noon on Saturday June 24 to Noon on Sunday June 25 all across North America. Each team tries to make as many contacts as possible with other Field Day teams during the 24-hour period.

The Colorado QRP Club, one of many Amateur Radio Clubs in Colorado, has operated one of the nation's top-ranked Field Day stations for many years. The club holds scoring records in several categories.

Members of the public are encouraged to stop by to find out more about Amateur Radio and Field Day.

Directions to the Colorado QRP Club site: From U.S. Hwy. 85 at Sedalia, take State Hwy. 67 approximately 10 miles west to the Forest Service Indian Creek Work center. Turn South on Rampart Range Road and travel about 7 miles. There will be a Colorado QRP Club banner sign near the road. The site is between the Jackson Creek Road intersection and the Devils Head Camp Ground on the east side of the road.
